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**Child Neglect -

"MIFGASH", a new

Child neglect is a common form of child maltreatment; however, it is considered a "neglected" form of maltreatment in terms of theory and practice, and not enough is known about effective evidence-based interventions for working with parents and families. The "MIFGASH" model was specifically developed in Israel to work with hard-to-reach clients, living mostly in peripheral geographical areas, and in marginalized and impoverished communities. It has been successfully implemented in Israel for the past five years and has showed good outcomes.

This two-part workshop is for professionals working with families through FCS. Workshop will entail presenting of this new model for intervention around child neglect and will also include a discussion around the relevance and applicability of the model (or parts of it) to the Oklahoma context.
